DID YOU KNOW THE WEST JORDAN ARENA HAS PRIZE WINNING DIRT?

It takes a special mix and hours of working the dirt to make it the right consistency so the livestock, cowboys, and cowgirls can safely compete on it. If it's too loose, horses can dig too deep and risk injury. If the dirt is too hard the riders can't get traction and may slip.

Hard dirt also poses a safety risk to animals and riders alike, and it's not too comfortable to land on. The dirt should be fluffy and light - but not so light that it kicks up too much dust. It's a science!

We tip our hats to volunteer extraordinaire, Steve Brower, who has spent countless hours on a tractor tilling and working the dirt so it's ready for all the different events that come to the West Jordan arena. We thank you Steve for sharing your time and talents with the Western Stampede!

RODEO ANNOUNCER

Being that he was at his first rodeo at just two weeks old, it's easy to say Garrett has been around rodeo all his life. His dad, Dale, is a former rodeo competitor and mom, Kathy, still competes in Barrel Racing. Kathy is a former International Finals Rodeo qualifier in the Barrel Racing and Dale is an 11-time IPRA World Champion in the Steer Wrestling and is currently the General Manager of the International Professional Rodeo Association. Garrett is a 2013 graduate of Pryor High School in Pryor, Oklahoma.

Garrett has been a very active member in the FFA serving as the Chapter Sentinel and later Vice-President. He was blessed enough to be the 2012 Oklahoma FFA Proficiency Winner in Agricultural Communications and went on to be the National Winner that same year. In 2013, he finished in the Top 3 for Northeast District Star in Agribusiness, received his State FFA Degree, and was the State and National Outdoor Recreation Proficiency Winner. In 2016 Garrett finished his FFA career by being a National Finalist for National Star in Agribusiness and receiving his American FFA Degree.

Garrett is currently a member of the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Assoc. (PRCA) and the International Pro Rodeo Assoc. (IPRA) and works approximately 150 performances per year. In 2014, Garrett set a record as the youngest announcer in the International Finals Rodeo's (IFR) now 54-year history! Garrett is a 7-time IFR Announcer. He also has been selected to work events such as the inaugural National Finals Breakaway Roping, The American Rodeo, Cheyenne Frontier Days, PRCA Xtreme Broncs Tour Finale, Colorado State Fair, 101 Wild West Pro Rodeo, and the National High School & Junior High Finals Rodeos. He was voted by his fellow PRCA members as the 2021 and 2022 Announcer of the Year! Garrett can be heard in states such as Oklahoma, Arkansas, Colorado, Nevada, Oregon, South Dakota, Texas, Wyoming, and more.

Tim Lepard


SPECIALTY ACT

Hailing from Mississippi, Tim grew up idolizing Elvis Presley and dreaming of performing for roaring crowds. Though his early aspirations leaned toward music, life took a wild turn when a failed military physical redirected his path—straight into the rodeo arena.

Inspired by his brother's stories from the military rodeo, Tim took up bull riding. But after earning just \$96 in four years, he realized his true calling was in the arena—but on foot, not in the saddle. He trained in Mesquite, Texas, under World Champion bullfighter Jimmy Anderson, who quickly recognized Tim's fearless spirit and natural comedic talent.

In 1977, Tim introduced a Capuchin monkey into his act, and in 1988, Jimmy helped him launch what would become an iconic rodeo comedy routine. Now known nationwide for his "Cowboy Monkey Rodeo" featuring Team Ghost Riders—Capuchin monkeys in full cowboy gear riding Border Collies—Tim has entertained crowds at NFL halftime shows, NASCAR races, major league baseball games, and even in Hollywood alongside Cameron Diaz.

Cervi Championship Rodeo

STOCK CONTRACTOR



When Mike purchased the rodeo company in 1967, all he wanted to provide quality stock for fans to enjoy. Today Cervi Championship Rodeo performs above and beyond his dreams, as they are the largest rodeo producers in the PRCA.

From the beginning, the Cervi's have been blessed to purchase superior bloodlines. One of Mike's top horses in the late 1960's included Descent, a six-time bucking horse of the year. Since then, the company has consistently taken horses and bulls to the National Finals Rodeo. To help the future of the industry, Cervi Championship Rodeo decided to purchase less of their stock and to further develop their breeding program in 1990. Today, their program consists of over 900 horses and over 150 bulls.

To get where they are today, Cervi Rodeo has worked with many stock contractors over the years in order to gain access to a more diverse gene pool. Cervi's and their partners have been able to interchange their studs, so that they are now able to breed over a hundred mares each season.

"It is just not in our [Cervi family] nature to do something mediocre," says Binion Cervi, Manager of Cervi Championship Rodeo.

In the late 1990's through early 2000's, Cervi's purchased a young filly named Big Sky. In her career, she went on to the National Finals Rodeo 10 times and was always featured with the best set of bucking horses, known as the "TV Pen." But it would not be until two generations later that her bloodlines would shine like she did.



Big Sky's great-grandson, Womanizer, born and raised on the Cervi Ranch, was voted as the 2020 PRCA Saddle Bronc Horse of the Year. Even though his career has just begun, he has consistently been one of the highest marked horses at every rodeo he performs at.



Yet even a horse like Womanizer, needs his teammates to make an outstanding rodeo performance complete. His colleagues, and family members, consist of horses like Avenger, the highest mark Saddle Bronc Horse of the 2020 National Finals Rodeo, and William Wallace bareback horse who has performed at the National Finals 5 years in a row, while placing in every round he competes in.

"We wait until our horses are 4 years old before they are bucked. So it is at least 5 years before we have any idea of how well they might do," explains Chase Cervi, a 2 time PRCA Pickup Man of the Year, and a 8 time National Finals Pickup Man, "But putting in years of hard work--the accomplishments have made it all worthwhile."

However, the work doesn't stop at raising them, Cervi Championship Rodeo strategizes to build the best team for the specific arena they will be performing in. Depending upon the arena size, location, weather, along with the horse's age, experience, and tendencies, are all factors that can help or hurt certain bucking horses.

Thanks to their long string of horses, the Cervi Brothers have the ability to bring in the right caliber of livestock for the best rodeo experience, at a minimal cost.

History of the Western Stampede Rodeo



The West Jordan Western Stampede has been a Utah tradition since 1954. That year, the first rodeo was held in the city by an amateur rodeo club; Jordan Agriculture. At the time, the town's board president asked to hold a special event in July as a celebration for the community.

From the beginning, members of the community made the entire event possible. Citizens contributed their time, labor, and equipment. Volunteers laid cinderblocks for the ticket booth and refreshment stand; others went as far as bringing their own backhoe to help bury pipe for the new bathrooms.

The first Western Stampede celebration was a success! One hour of the rodeo was televised. The other events included a parade, tug-of-war competition, wild horse race, a dog act, a beard contest, horse pulling, and a greased pig chase. The event drew large crowds and loyal fans for years to come.

While much has changed over the years with the Western Stampede, one thing has remained the same. The Western Stampede is a group effort. It would not be possible without the hardworking people who love their city and this tradition.
